Carolyn:

Thank you for your kind e-mail. I appreciate your service to our City.

The process is not a good one and is one that continues to show the mismanagement of Deltona City government. Actually, the process is worse than I thought. I thought that the initial action relative to the process commenced the first week in December. Actually, the City Commission at its meeting of November 21, 2005 took the action below.

That means that

- (1) 10 days in November,
- (2) All of December,
- (3) All of January,
- (4) All of February,
- (5) All of March
- (6) All of April

and

- (7) All of May

Will pass BEFORE the City Commission starts its interview process.

That being said, if

- (8) A selection is made in June
- (9) And the selected candidate can arrive in July

Almost 9 months will have passed (at least assuming nothing goes wrong and the selectee can make a quick transition to a new job) in order to have City Manager on board.

That means that Mr. Blossom will run the City in the mismanaged and embarrassing way that he has and that the new City Manager will not be able to develop and implement her/his own budget. It also means that, since an interim city manager was not selected to study the City and its management and assist in the selection of the new City Manager and develop a budget as a skilled manager, the mismanagement of the City will continue. That troubles me.

I believe that this is all being orchestrated by Mr. Blossom to avoid scrutiny.

I believe that the process is being manipulated and that the City Commission is not serving the City well by allowing this to happen.

I think that you and the rest of the Committee should demand change and reject the way that things have been manipulated to occur.

I hope that these views are clear and helpful.

Thanks again for your service. The problem is that the City of Deltona is being hurt by things continuing as they have been allowed to occur.

Excerpt From November 21, 2005 City Commission Meeting

D. Appointment of Interim City Manager and discussion on hiring process.

Mayor Mulder stated that he felt the best way to approach the selection of a new City Manager was to form a

7-member Citizens' Committee with each Commissioner appointing one member to actively work with a

search firm (headhunter). The search firm would be used to further short list the candidates which could then

be selected by the City Commission for interviews in a public meeting. Commissioner Harvey stated the

City went through this process in 1998 and he did serve on the Citizens' Selection Committee at that time.

He stated that the Committee narrows down the applicant list to what the Commission wants to deal with, but

the Commission retains the right to reach outside the scope of the Committee's recommendation.

Commissioner Harvey suggested that the Commission retain Mr. Blossom as the Interim City Manager.

Commissioner McFall agreed with the use of a Citizens' Committee and a search firm and she also supported

Mr. Blossom as the Interim Manager. Commissioner Deyette stated that the headhunter firm's charge would

be to reduce the applicants to a viable number and she also expressed her support of Mr. Blossom.

Motion

by Commissioner Harvey, seconded by Commissioner McFall to appoint Mr. Blossom as Interim City

Manager. Motion carried with members voting as follows: Commissioner Carmolingo, For; Commissioner Deyette, For; Commissioner Harvey, For; Commissioner McFall, For; Vice Mayor Santiago, For; and Mayor Mulder; For.

Mr. Blossom suggested that the Commission proceed with a citizens group to determine the top candidates in

the opinion of the citizens' group. He stated the hope was to attract 75-100 applicants and to use the help of

consultant for the final short list. He stated that generally consultants demand \$25,000 for their services for

the full process and his hope was to be able to get someone to do the job for \$10,000 – 15,000.

Commissioner Harvey questioned if Mr. Blossom believed that the Commission would be able to identify

the person who will be the perfect fit for Deltona. Mr. Blossom stated he was not sure there will be a perfect

fit, but the citizens review process worked well earlier with the hiring of Mr. Behring.

Commissioner Deyette questioned how the Commission would select citizens for the Committee. Mr.

Blossom stated the Committee positions would be posted as available. Commissioner McFall stated that the

Committee needed to be comprised of residents of Deltona, and interested individuals should be directed to

complete the on-line application form and that the appointments be treated like any other Committee appointee and she felt the Committee should consist of seven members. Commissioner Harvey stated he wanted quality representation from the public, not just quantity; and seven would be a manageable and productive number.

Mr. Blossom suggested setting a deadline of December 12th for interested individuals to apply to serve on the

Citizens' Selection Committee. Discussion followed regarding the number of candidates to be included on

the final short list and the Commission concurred to make that decision after the applications were received.

Motion by Commissioner McFall, seconded by Commissioner Carmolingo to direct staff to advertise

for a seven member City Manager Search Committee, to be appointed one from each Commissioner,

with a deadline of December 15th for receipt of the applications and appointment at the first meeting

in January 2006 and also to direct staff to prepare an RFP for a consultant to assist the Commission in

the City Manager search process. Vice Mayor Santiago stated that as part of the interview process, he would like to have the opportunity for an individual interview process, Commissioner and applicant, and then to conduct formal interviews before the full Commission at a public meeting. **Commissioner McFall**

agreed to amend her motion to include an individual interview process as well as formal interviews

before the full Commission at a public meeting. Motion carried with members voting as follows:

Commissioner Carmolingo, For; Commissioner Deyette, For; Commissioner Harvey, For;

Commissioner McFall, For; Vice Mayor Santiago, For; and Mayor Mulder; For.---
